WELCOME

We can't quite believe it, but it's already been a year since we moved to our new home at Lanternhouse. We've loved seeing familiar and new faces alike come through these doors and want to thank you all for your great feedback and support over the year.

As you flick through the pages of this brochure, you will see everything from thrillingly intense theatre, breath-taking concerts, outrageous stand-up comedy, and everything in-between. We have exciting new collaborations, live screenings and lots of opportunities to join our Take Part programme. Whatever your taste, there's something for you.

Our theatre programme kicks off with our Autumn in-house production **Bold Girls** by Scottish playwright Rona Munro, a sharply funny yet moving piece directed by Michael Duke and first performed at Cumbernauld Theatre thirty years ago. The fantastic shows keep coming in November with the unmissable **Enough of Him** from the **National Theatre of Scotland**. Other highlights include productions from **Shotput**, **Wonder Fools**, **Jordan & Skinner Theatre Company**, and **Toucan Theatre's The Naughty Fox** for families with wee ones. In December we partner with **Visible Fictions** to present our Christmas inhouse production **Treasure Island**, developed from the classic tale by Robert Louis Stevenson. We also have something special for our under 5s production, **Life of the Party**. In both productions the theatre, story and props 'come to life' to create a magical festive experience for all ages!

We are hugely excited to host **Dunedin Consort**, one of the world's leading Baroque ensembles, in a unique residency at Lanternhouse this

season. Throughout the next year the musicians will offer a fantastic series of relaxed concerts, open rehearsals, cinema concert screenings and specially devised events for children and families. This includes a bespoke programme of instrumental workshops and classes for local schools to inspire and encourage an interest in classical music.

Another highlight of our music programme is **Lost in Music**, an epic gig-theatre show inspired by the myth of Orpheus and Euridice devised by **Magnetic North**. We're also showcasing Scotland's rising talent with our **Emerging Music** programme and welcoming the return of **Elaine Lennon's Homebird Sessions**. Not to mention we have Scottish folk band **Fara**, hours of **Clapton Classics** and a tea dance with **Jon Ritchie & That Swing Sensation** - we are sure you will agree there's plenty to enjoy.

And there's more... our Take Part programme with high-quality creative classes is for everyone (yes, that means you). Our community classes span drama, dance, sensory arts, crafting and circus performance – there's bound to be something to get your creativity flowing. If you're a budding poet or storyteller we've also got a brand-new open mic night just for you.

...and if that isn't enough, our cinema is regularly screening the latest blockbusters with a special toddler-friendly showing each week. We've got a wide array of cinema events coming to our theatre, and for the first time we will screen live theatre performances from London's **National Theatre** and the **Royal Opera House**. In fact, you could spend the next six months at Lanternhouse without leaving the building. Given our chilly winters, that might be a smart move!

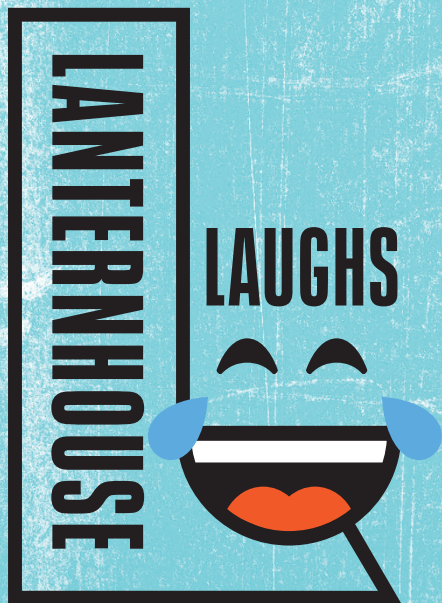

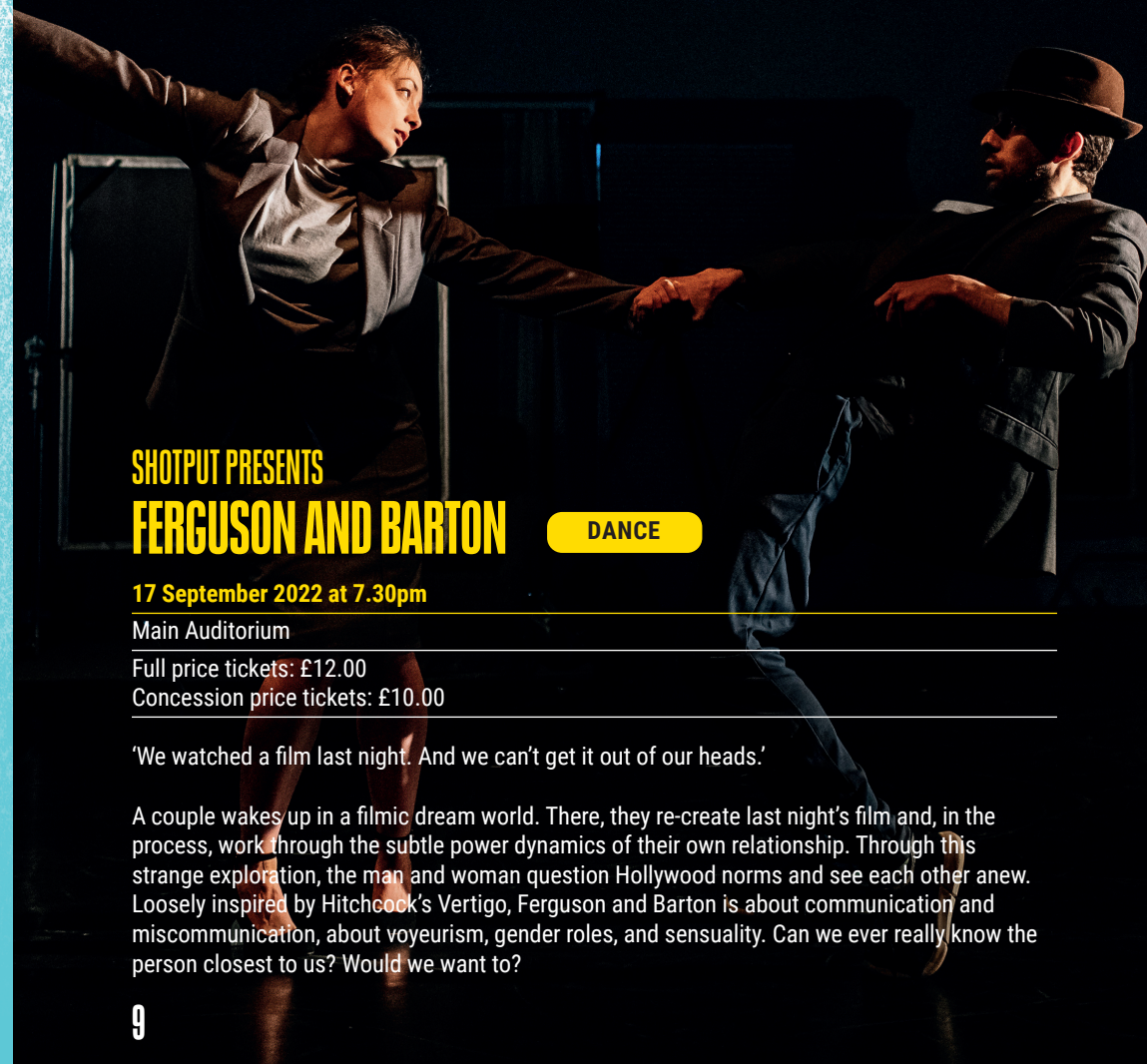

It's 1991 in West Belfast. With their husbands either locked up or killed, Marie, Cassie and Nora are just trying to get on with their lives, despite the bombs and burning buses. Life must go on – after all, there's still laundry to do, bills to pay and kids to feed.

But when a mysterious young woman turns up on Marie's doorstep and disrupts their girls' night out, the devastating revelations which ensue will shatter dreams and threaten their friendship irrevocably. Sharply funny, moving, yet never shying from the harsh realities of life during the Troubles, Bold Girls is a celebration of women's strength under siege.

The play was first performed by 7:84 Scottish People's Theatre at Cumbernauld Theatre in 1990 and on tour. This new production as part of our Autumn Season is being Directed by Michael Duke former Tinderbox Theatre Company (Belfast) Artistic Director, who is originally from County Down, and currently based in Glasgow.

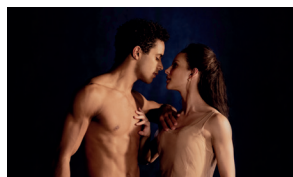

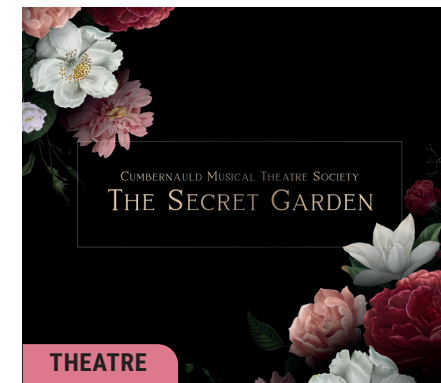

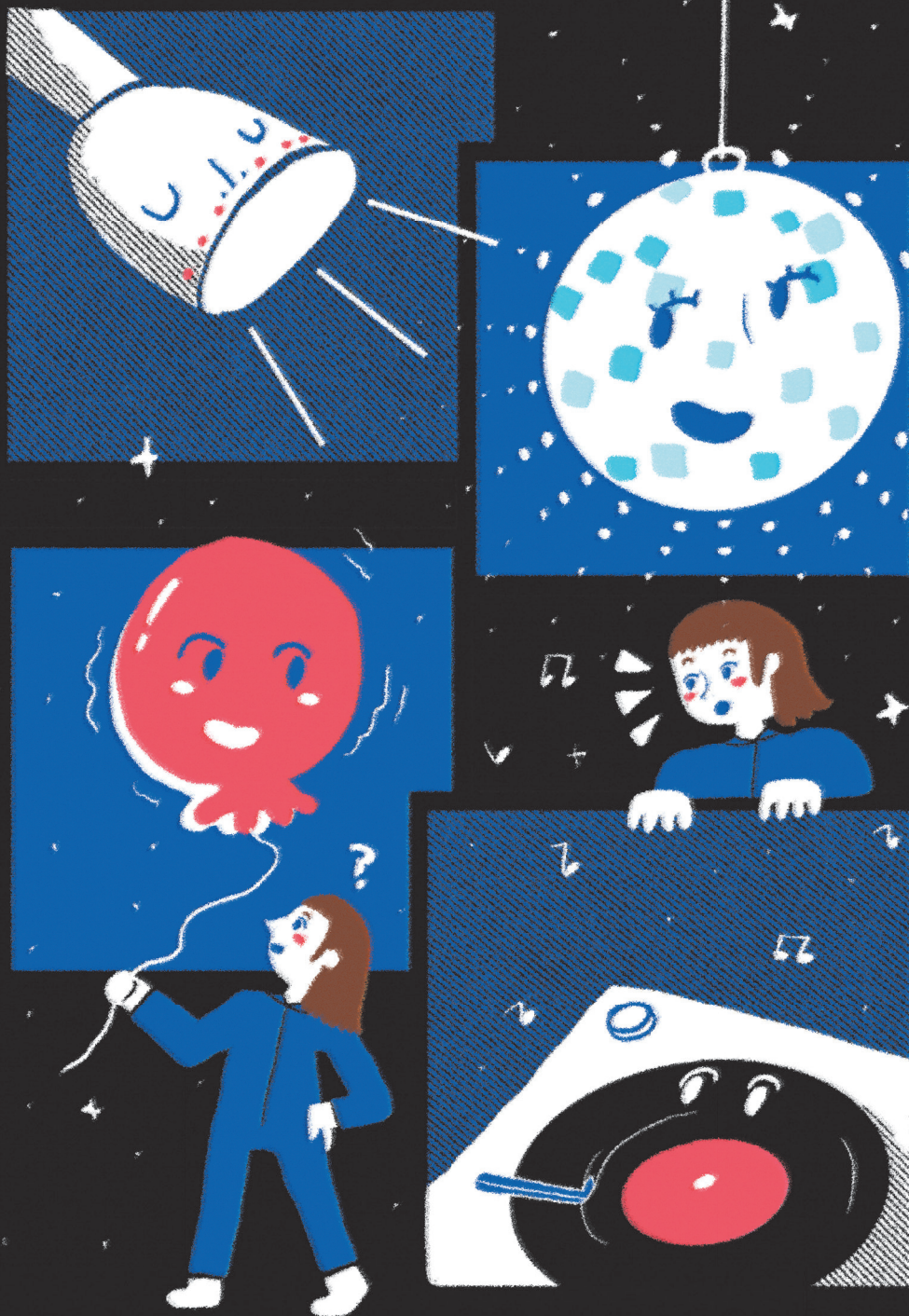
