We are delighted to welcome you our brand-new production of Crocodile Rock. Andy McGregor's one-man musical, which was previously performed by A Play, A Pie and a Pint and screened on the BBC, has received substantial investment from Cumbernauld Theatre Trust to bring a reimagined Crocodile Rock to the audience at Lanternhouse. The production features an updated score of original music and a specially commissioned set and costumes.

The funny and often poignant story follows a teenage Steven McPhail on his journey to self acceptance, while navigating life on the small island of Millport in the 90s. Steven knows that he doesn't quite fit in and that there must be more exciting things in life than Millport's rock painted to look like a crocodile! A chance encounter with an exotic drag queen one evening is the catalyst for him to begin to discover his true, authentic self.

Writer and Director Andy McGregor said: "I am really excited to be bringing Crocodile Rock back to the stage for Cumbernauld Theatre. It's a show that audiences really responded to when we first created it. It's funny, moving, absolutely Scottish and has a breathtaking performance at it's heart. It's a real joy to be able to work on it again and breathe new life into it. I'm also more than excited to be working with Darren Brownlie once again, the skill, passion and sheer talent the man possesses boggles the mind!"

The 85 min musical touches on a number of relatable themes including social exclusion, gender stereotypes, bullying and the often complex relationships we have with our families.

Andy McGregor is a Scottish playwright, director and composer. He trained at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland and the University of Glasgow. National Theatre of Scotland work includes assistant director In Time O' Strife, Dragon and composer/facilitator for The Tin Forest Southwest/East End. Other work includes Spuds, The Rise and Inevitable Fall of Lucas Petite and Love 2.0 with Sleeping Warrior. Crocodile Rock, Vinyl Idol and Pure Freezin' for A Play a Pie and a Pint. Primetime at The Royal Court, The Ugly One at The Tron and numerous Christmas shows for wee ones at The Citizens Theatre. His play Influence was commissioned and performed by 6 UK-wide theatres from Dundee Rep to Plymouth Royal. The Snow Queen for Pace. Godspell, The Comedy of Errors, Naughty Cat and the Cheesy Moon, Towards the Moon and Twelfth Night for the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland. Crocodile Rock was presented on BBC Scotland. Andrew received the Playwrights Studio New Playwright award and the John Mather 'Rising Star' award, he is a regular visiting lecturer at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland.


ANDY MANNING

As a composer, Andy's musical 'Saucery' was workshopped at the Court Theatre Midwinter Readings, and 'GLO' workshopped at Auckland Theatre Company's Here and Now Festival. They have composed music for numerous Tim Bray Productions and worked with Tusk Puppets to create their first full-length puppet show, The Lost Sock. They composed and were Sound Designer for Stephen King's Misery.

In Scotland, Andy was MD for Legally Blonde and Pippin (Royal Conservatoire of Scotland), MD for R&Ds of Nessie and Rebel (Festival Theatre), Sound Designer for 'Is That You, Santa', MD for All I Want For Christmas is You and 'Santa's Magical Lighthouse' (MacRobert Theatre).
