

PEOPLE'S THEATRE COMPANY

Our People's Theatre Company is a community theatre project that offers adults aged 18+ who are interested in theatre and the performing arts the opportunity to work collaboratively with artists and theatre practitioners to develop socially engaged theatre projects at Cumbernauld Theatre.

PROJECT AIMS

To create an inclusive, socially engaged community-based theatre project that allows participants to develop skills in theatre, acting, writing, film, and the performing arts

- To develop participants self-confidence and self-esteem
- To encourage and unlock creativity and creative potential
- To develop theatre and performing arts skills,
- · To promote community connectivity, and develop community empowerment
- To promote friendships and social connectivity
- To develop sense of place belonging
- To offer participants the opportunity to present, share, and showcase work at Cumbernauld Theatre

To create an inclusive, socially engaged community-based theatre project that allows participants to develop skills in theatre, acting, writing, film, and the performing arts

Cumbernauld Theatre People's Theatre Company works collaboratively with participants through weekly workshop and rehearsal programme. Working in partnership with artists and project with the project theatre artists the group develop, and devise theatre socially engaged theatre, film and writing projects with our community to develop Community and Individual Empowerment, Artistic Skills Development, Cultural Enrichment, Community Cohesion, Sustainable Practises, and Climate awareness.

PROCESS

The starting point for any drama is lived experience. With 'night in the Nauld 'the purpose was to give a true and accurate reflection of the individuals that may inhabit Cumbernauld. There are many stereotypes associated with Cumbernauld and the project allowed the opportunity to tackle these.

A starting point was 'What's it called?' Using the oft quoted marketing campaign but ending the quote with inhabitant's thoughts.

Each character had a perception of Cumbernauld. Within the group there were participants that were newcomers to Scotland and an individual transitioning gender. Although their stories were deeply personal, they used the play as an opportunity to educate the audience and see things from the other side.

At the core of the production was a sense of community and how adversity can unite a community.

In working with the group before I could present a community on stage, I had to have the group think of themselves as a community. Supportive of one another. I achieved this by doing lots of trust and bonding exercises. The cast took ownership of the production by

helping construct the narrative and creative decisions. This I feel meant the cast were more connected to the work. It was their voice.

The piece focused on naturalism. The cast had to find a truth not just in their character but also in their

performance.




PARTICIPANT EVALUATIONS

How would you rate the quality of the experience? Where 1 is poor and 5 is excellent






Getting involved in more productions, helping behind scenes and job roles if anything opens up, is something I'm extremely interested in.


EQUALITY OF PARTICIPATION

i.e opportunity to access food or drink was affordable (63%)




REDUCED LIVING COSTS

MAKING CUMBERNAULD THE STAGE


