Other directing work includes Waves (2021), *Svetlana* (2020), *Moonlight on Leith* (2018) and for Traverse Young Writers (2022). Laila is a literary producer and mentor for Page2Stage Edinburgh and has her own Company, ClartyBurd (New Scottish Companies Award 2021). As a writer, Laila was the inaugural winner of the St. Andrews Playwriting Award with her play *Y Dyn yn y Llong Danfor* [The Man in the Submarine].
